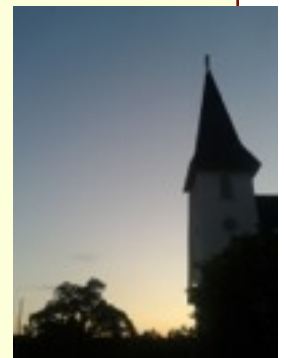

PASTOR'S REFLECTIONS

What are we called to do? Has God placed in your heart an answer to that question? Or have you found yourself lost in how to begin.

This past week, as I went to a workshop on "Walking Across the Road," I was given four questions that struck me as questions that might help us find answers.

1. What ministries does your church have that reach out to non church members in the community?
2. What outside ongoing groups meet in your church and reach into the community?
3. What special events or occasional activities does your church host that reach community residents?
4. What are the assets of your church which are or could be used in developing partnerships?

In Jeremiah 29:7 we are reminded by the prophet that our welfare is found in the welfare of the community in which God has sent us. These four questions challenged me as I reflected on Jeremiah's words. How are we seeking the

welfare of the Bobbitt community? This month my prayer is that we focus not on what we are called to do, but what assets we have as this Body of Christ.
