For example - we expand the kitchen so that we can serve meals to the hungry in the Kittrell area.

For example - we upgrade our handicapped accessibility so that we can have a weekly adult day care drop in center (meeting once a week)

The mission of Plank Chapel UMC is to be making disciples for Jesus Christ and for serving the least, last, and lost in our community. The Trustees have a mission to care for the structure in which we do this ministry. We may want to consider asking ourselves what ministry is God

calling us to as we move into the future. How does our current structure provide for that ministry? What changes should the Trustees be considering so that our future ministry is not hindered by the structure itself?

This meeting in January is the first of a quarterly series of meetings for us to come together as a church body and look at our mission, ministry, and vision for the future.

As we move towards the future let us pray together for God to move within us and our direction and vision be of God.
