



Pastor's Note

I'm excited to be back home from the Pastor's Continuing Education that brought me to Africa and Asia. Indeed, the journey was refreshing, empowering and life-giving! And I want to express my deepest gratitude to Rev. Jenny Wilson & Bro. Garry Dickerson for their inspiring preaching, and Rev. Carol Dean who served as pastor-on-call. I'm also grateful to our District Superintendent Rev. Dr. David Joyner, Bethel UMC Leadership Team & Plank Chapel UMC Pastor-Parish Relations Team for their blessings and support.

Throughout my trip abroad, God showed me that Christianity is expanding rapidly across Africa and Asia, becoming the new center of global faith. In Africa, I had a wonderful opportunity to experience worshipping (and even dancing) at the historic Methodist Church in Ghana. While in Asia, I attended worship at Kwanglim Church in South Korea, the largest Methodist church in the world with more than 90,000 members. The church growth in Africa and Asia are driven not only by vibrant local leadership and dynamic evangelism that adapts to diverse cultures but also by strong mission and outreach to their community and beyond. They are turning their faith into action!

Methodists in Africa and Asia are taking John Wesley's words seriously: "there is no religion but social religion, no holiness but social holiness." What Wesley meant here is that he is against a "privatized" notion of Christian faith. Wesley spread scriptural holiness in the 18th century England—immersing himself in the community, ministering with the prisoners, the outcasts and the marginalized. He spoke out courageously and prophetically on issues such as slavery, economic exploitation, the abuse of alcohol and all kinds of corruption. Wesley was deeply involved in ministry with the poor, in prison reform and in effort to abolish the slavery.

The Methodist movement engaged in social witness, in impacting communities and transforming the world for the sake of Jesus Christ. For John Wesley, the Methodist movement was not just about the personal assurance of salvation. Rather, Wesley saw a faith that is dynamic, transformative, impacting the community and transforming the world for the sake of Jesus Christ. John Wesley brought together a sense of balance between faith and good works, personal assurance and social witness, knowledge and vital piety, nurture and mission. In other words, John Wesley wanted the people called Methodists to practice the greatest commandment in the Bible that: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind... and "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:37 & 39)

Here in the United States, we are experiencing schools that are struggling to provide basic education with children falling through the cracks, criminal justice systems that are overcrowded, increasing population who are hungry, lonely and depressed, fears among migrants, rising domestic violence, growing inequality between the rich and the poor, among others. As disciples of Jesus Christ, we cannot live as if these things have nothing to do with us. We can't moan about how somebody ought to do something. And we cannot merely lift those who suffer in prayer asking God to do for us what God created us to do for God! As disciples of Christ and as a church, we are called to turn our "faith into action" such as supporting the Blessing Box Ministry, ACTS in Henderson, Fresh Expressions, Area Congregations in Ministry, Zeb Vance Elementary School and our new missional outreach: "Project Be A Blessing".

The Bible says that "Faith without works is dead." (James 2:26) This powerful statement emphasizes that our belief in God must be accompanied by actions that reflect that faith. Without action, faith becomes meaningless, or at worst, it does not exist. That is why we are called to break our hearts for those that break the heart of Jesus— the oppressed, the sick, the outcast, and the most vulnerable in society. Jesus lifts up the bent-over woman on Sabbath, touches the unclean with healing power, releases the paralyzed from his bed, eats with tax-collectors in their homes, and risks the violence of the mob to intervene for the woman caught in adultery.

Indeed, Jesus is calling us to turn our "faith into action" when He said, "I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." (Matthew 25:35-36) The disciples can't imagine what He is talking about until Jesus says, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:40)

A private lunch prepared by camp staff followed in the facility's main hall with a themed blessing from Camp Director Rev. Nick Jeffries.

The youngsters headed into the woods after lunch for a robust team-building experience which included a large balancing platform, cable walk, wall climb and other activities.

Younger children then broke off for playground time and an egg hunt with leadership team members Nancy Gustafson and Judy DeJesus.

The other youth split into two groups to participate in both tree climbing and a thrilling zip line crossing the lake. Journey leaders Lora and Wayne Young opted to soar across the lake as well. The kids had an opportunity to zip line twice before the two groups switched locations to enjoy the two adventures.

Chestnut Ridge is part of the United Methodist Camp and Retreat Ministries.

The next Journey meeting will be held at Plank Chapel United Methodist Church, 4 to 6 p.m., Sunday, Sept. 28. Journey will also host its Second Annual Trunk or Treat at the church on Oct. 28 with plans for a hayride in November.

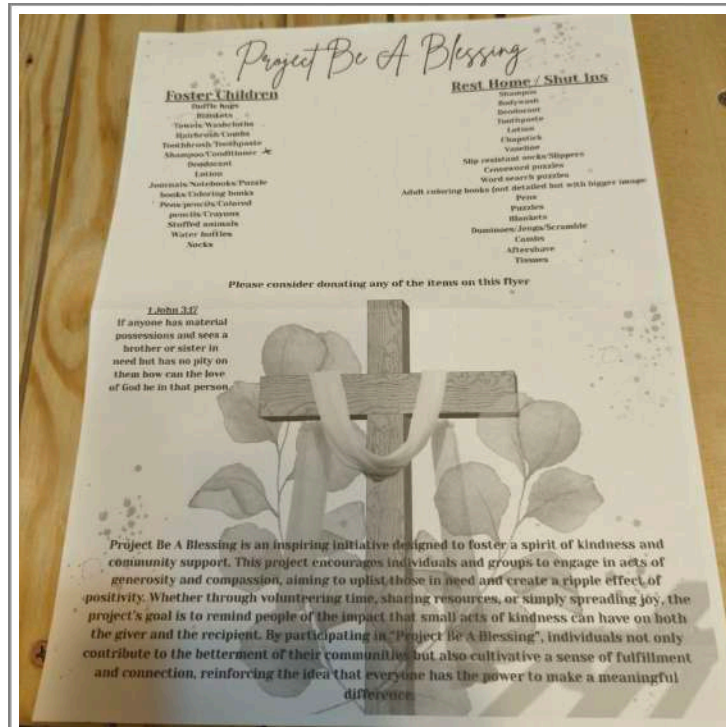
